Thomas Wilkinson is University Organist and Director of Chapel Choirs at the University of St Andrews. Born in 1985, he studied at St Mary's Music School, Edinburgh, going on to become Organ Scholar of Truro Cathedral, Cornwall. In 2004 he took up the Organ Scholarship at The Queen's College, Oxford, and graduated with a first-class honours degree in Music in 2007. In the same year, Thomas took the Fellowship Diploma of the Royal College of Organists. From 2008-9 he held the position of Assistant Director of Music at Chelmsford Cathedral. In addition to his role at St Andrews, Thomas is studying for a Masters degree in Early Keyboard Performance at the University of Edinburgh, under Dr John Kitchen.

As a conductor, his main role is director of St Salvator's Chapel Choir, the flagship choir of the University of St Andrews. Under his leadership, the choir has performed across Scotland and has toured Italy and Germany, giving concerts in venues such as Cologne Cathedral. The choir has premiered music by many composers, including Paul Mealor and Ben Parry. Thomas's first CD recording with St Salvator's Chapel Choir is to be released in November 2012. As an organist, Thomas has performed throughout Europe and in Africa, Asia and the USA. Within the UK he has performed in St Paul's Cathedral, Westminster Abbey, the cathedrals of Coventry, Salisbury and Wells, and the Usher Hall, Edinburgh. He has also made several broadcasts on BBC Radio 3.
