Paul Stubbings was born in East Yorkshire in 1969 and educated at Chetham's School of Music and Manchester University, studying organ with Francis Jackson and Gordon Stewart. In 1990 a Countess of Munster grant enabled him to pursue advanced organ studies with Jacques van Oortmerssen at the Amsterdam Conservatoire where he subsequently gained the Prix d'Excellence, 'cum laude'.

For ten years he was Master of the Music at the Royal Parish Church of St Martin-in-the-Fields before moving to full-time education. Whilst Director of Music at St Lawrence College, Ramsgate he maintained an international profile as a recitalist, playing in churches, cathedrals and concert halls throughout Europe, Australia and Canada. In April this year he was appointed Director of Music at St Mary's Music School here in Edinburgh.
