CONCERT PROGRAMMES.

Six Guest-Conductors have been invited to direct the Reid Orchestral Concerts this season in the absence on leave of Professor Sidney Newman, who has conducted throughout the past seventeen seasons. Three of these conductors have long and close association with the Reid Concerts. Dr. John Fairbairn, Leader of the Orchestra, and Dr. Mary Grierson will both conduct two concerts, and Dr. Gal will appear as composer-conductor in the Edinburgh première of his Pianoforte-Concerto with Francis Bamberger as soloist.

It is a particular pleasure to be able to announce the association with the Reid concerts this season of three distinguished musicians who are prominently associated with other public musical enterprises in Scotland. Mr Thomas Matthews, Leader and Assistant-Conductor of the Scotlish National Orchestra, will give the first performance in Scotland of the Shostakovich Ninth Symphony, in a concert which also includes Eileen Ralf as soloist in the great B flat pianoforte-concerto of Brahms (which has not been given at a Reid Concert since the war-years). Dr. Ian Whyte, Conductor of the B.B.C. Scottish Orchestra will be responsible for the Reid Memorial Concert, with a programme substantially of Viennese classical music, but which also happily introduces him as composer-conductor with his Suite for Strings. Dr. Henry Havergal, Principal of the Royal Scottish Academy of Music, is rehearsing the University Musical Society Choir throughout this season, and will conduct the Verdi "Requiem" at the final concert of the series.

With respect to concertos, apart from the Dvorak Violoncello Concerto with Miss Joan Dickson as soloist, the emphasis this season is upon the pianoforte. In addition to the concertos and artists already mentioned, the Prokofiev No. 3, to be presented by Mr Wight Henderson, makes a welcome reappearance at

these concerts after an interval of a dozen years or so.

In the Chamber Music Concerts special mention should be made of the return to Edinburgh of Mr Wenzinger and his renowned Consort of Viols from Basle. This ensemble, which has long been of world-fame through its recordings and broadcasts, was introduced to Edinburgh at a special concert in the Reid School of Music some ten years ago. It is hoped that patrons will make a special note of this single Wednesday date, which is necessitated by the artists' commitments abroad.

The New Edinburgh Quartet offers two quartet concerts, a programme for pianoforte and string ensemble in collaboration with Dr. Grierson, and a programme of trios including the delicious Beethoven Serenade (with George Gwilt) and the great concertante-like Divertimento of Mozart. The Aeolian Quartet offers some rarities, Dvorak's last (and possibly greatest) Quartet in G, Kenneth Leighton's First Quartet, which was commissioned by the B.B.C. for the tenth anniversary of the Third Programme and broadcast by these artists, and the Beethoven "Harp" which is all too seldom heard.

The Lieder-recital this season will be given by a newcomer to this series,

the fine English Contralto Miss Helen Watts.

Patrons of these concerts may be interested to know that extensive alterations have been carried out this summer in respect of the heating, ventilating and lighting of the Reid School, which it is hoped will add very considerably to the amenity of the building as a public concert hall.

The Choir will give its annual Carol Party in the McEwan Hall on 11th

December.
